Roles and importance of food in daily life, cultures and consumption behavior around the world including the influence of foreign cultures on Thai consumption behavior, identity and wisdom of food in Thailand, proper food selections according to basic needs, food choices, information for purchasing food, and food and life style according in the age of globalization

**001278 Life and Health****3(3-0-6)**

Integrated knowledge and understanding about the life cycle; healthy behaviors and human health care; adolescence and exercise and recreation for health; enrichment of mental health; medicine and health; environment and health; health insurance, life insurance. Accident insurance. And social security; protection from danger, accidents, natural disasters and communicable diseases

**205200 Communicative English for Specific Purposes****1(0-2-1)**

Practice listening and speaking English with emphasis on pronunciation, vocabulary, expressions, and sentence structures for academic and professional purposes.

**205201 Communicative English for Academic Analysis****1(0-2-1)**

Practice listening and speaking English with emphasis on summarizing, analyzing, interpreting, and expressing opinions for academic purposes applicable to students' educational fields.

**205202 Communicative English for Research Presentation 1(0-2-1)**

Practice giving oral presentations on academic research related to students' educational fields with effective delivery in English.

**230100 Civil Law : General Principles 3(3-0-6)**

Meaning, evolution, fundamental principles of civil and private law ; sources of law, division of law; application and interpretation of law; filling gaps of law; principles of right holders. Types, exercising, sources, changes, transference and extinction of rights. Including principles under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book I : (General Provisions and Persons).

**230101 Juristic Act and Contract Law 3(3-0-6)**

The law of juristic act under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book I, title IV to V, declaration and effect of intention, periods of time and prescription. The Law of contract under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book II, Title II, (the formation, effect, and termination) of contract, Law pertaining to unfair contract terms.

**230102 Introduction of Public Law 3(3-0-6)**

Evolution, sources, philosophy, meaning, characteristics and types of public law. Theories about state's administrative structuring; power and significant theories pertaining to the exercise of power, especially separation of powers; discretionary power and mandatory power.

**230200 Obligation Law 3(2-2-5)**

Meaning, source, subject, and effect of obligations, joint debtors and creditors, including the extinction of obligations under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book II including various case studies.

**230201 Wrongful Acts, Management of Affairs without Mandate, and Undue Enrichment Law 3(3-0-6)**

Law of the liability and the compensation for wrongful acts, justifiable acts, management of affairs without mandate and undue enrichment under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book II, Title III, IV and V, including liability for wrongful acts of officials.

**230202 Property Law****3(2-2-5)**

Meaning, division things under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book I and the law of properties under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book IV including various case studies.

**230203 Criminal Law : General Principles****3(2-2-5)**

General principles of criminal law, application of criminal law, punishments and measures of safety, criminal liability, criminal attempt, principals and accessories, concurrence of offences, recidivist, prescription, and laws applicable to petty offences according to the Penal Code, Book I including various case studies.

**230204 Constitutional Law****3(2-2-5)**

History, meaning and evolution of constitutional law, political institutions; constitutional rights and freedom of people; significant theories of constitution, such as, sovereignty, separation of powers, and control of constitutional conformity including various case studies.

**230205 Criminal Law : Specific Offenses****3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to specific offenses in Book II of the Penal Code and petty offenses including various case studies.

**230206 Specific Contracts I****3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to sale, exchange, gift, hire of property, and hire purchase according to the Civil and Commercial Code, Book III including various case studies.

**230207 Loan, Deposit, and Security Transactions Law****3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to loan, deposit, surety ship, mortgage pledge, and securities for various types of debt, under the Civil and Commercial Code, Book III including various case studies.

**230208 Constitution of Courts of Justice and the Thai Judicial System****2(2-0-4)**

History of courts of justice and the law relating to their jurisdiction. The court systems; single court system, dual, and specialized court systems. The panel of judges in deciding



cases, the structure and judicial administration of courts of justice, administrative court, military court, and constitutional court.

### **230300 Negotiable Instruments**

**3(3-0-6)**

Legal principles pertaining to bills and current account; the general provisions of bill, bill of exchange, drawing and endorsement of bill of exchange and acceptance according to the Civil and Commercial Code, Book III, including types of negotiable instruments.

### **230301 Specific Contracts II**

**3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to agency, brokerage and carriage according to the Civil and Commercial Code, Book III including various case studies.

### **230302 Partnership and Company Law**

**3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to partnership and companies such as fund raising, management, relation of partners between themselves and with third persons, power, duty and liability of directors and executives. The registration of ordinary partnership, limited partnership and limited company. Criminal liability of business organizations, directors and executives. The topics include the substantial principles under the Public Companies Act including various case studies.

### **230303 Family Law**

**3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to family law, engagement, marriage and its legal consequences, nullity and dissolution of marriage, matrimonial property, parents and children, custody and adoption, maintenance according to the Civil and Commercial Code, Book V including various case studies.

### **230304 Succession Law**

**3(2-2-5)**



Legal principles pertaining to succession, general provisions, statutory right of inheritance, wills, administration and distribution of an estate. Vacant estates and prescription according to the Civil and Commercial Code, Book VI including various case studies.

**230305 Civil Procedure Law I**

**3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to civil procedure, general provisions and procedure in courts of first instance according to the Civil Procedure Code, Books I and II including various case studies.

**230306 Civil Procedure Law II**

**3(3-0-6)**

Legal principles pertaining to civil procedure, appeal and revision, provisional measures before judgment, execution of judgments or orders according to the Civil Procedure Code Books III and IV.

**230307 Criminal Procedure Law**

**3(2-2-5)**

Legal principles pertaining to criminal procedure, power of inquiry officials and competency of courts, prosecution of criminal cases, procedures in court of first instance, appeal and revision according to the Criminal Procedure Code including various case studies.

**230308 Evidence Law**

**3(3-0-6)**

Characteristics and criteria for taking evidence in court in both civil suits and criminal cases, the admissibility and exclusion of evidence, hearsay evidence and opinions in evidence, legal presumptions and burden of proof according to the Civil Procedure Code, Section I, and the of Criminal Procedure Code, Section V.

**230309 Insurance Law**

**2(2-0-4)**

Legal principles pertaining to insurance, general principles of insurance law, insurance against loss, special rules for insurance on carriage, guarantee insurance and insurance on life according to the Civil and Commercial Code, Book III.

**230330 Administrative Law**

**3(2-2-5)**

General principles and significant characteristics of administrative law, administrative organs, administrative acts, legal effect of administrative acts, revocation of administrative acts, administrative execution, procedures performed by administrative officials, public service, administration of state organs. The topics include organization and jurisdiction of administrative courts, administrative court's procedure and execution of administrative judgments including various case studies.

#### **230400 Bankruptcy and Reconstruction Law**

**2(2-0-4)**

Evolution, characteristic and objective of bankruptcy law, debtors' asset management, roles of receivers, court's competence, bankruptcy procedures, reconstruction and debt restructuring

#### **230401 Labor Law**

**3(3-0-6)**

Legal principles pertaining to labor law, evolution of labor law, hire-of-work agreements. Labor relation law, labor protection, alien labor protection, labor dispute settlement and procedures in labor cases and other related laws.

#### **230402 Public International Law**

**3(2-2-5)**

Characteristic and sources of public international law, legal persons in public international law, exercising of state jurisdiction, state maritime jurisdiction and maritime delimitation, relationship between international law and domestic law, international liability of states, dispute settlement among states including various case studies.

#### **230403 Taxation Law**

**3(3-0-6)**

Principles of taxation, legal principles pertaining to personal income tax, corporate income tax, value added tax, specific business tax and stamp duty according to the Revenue Code and tax treaties.

#### **230404 Private International Law**

**3(3-0-6)**

Meaning and characteristic of private international law, nationality, status of nationals and aliens, conflict of laws, proceeding of cases with foreign elements.

#### **230405 Legal Profession**

**2(2-0-4)**

Evolution of legal profession, responsibilities, duties and works of lawyers in various branches, ethics, discipline and the ideal of lawyers, establishing organizations and means to control those in the profession.

#### **230406 Thai Legal History**

**2(2-0-4)**

Social history and ancient cultures of the Thai society, the fundamental ideas of the ancient Indian legal system, including the influences of Indian legal system and ancient Thai cultures on Thai laws, sources and evolution of ancient Thai laws (from Thai law in the historical eras to Thai law in the present time), especially the circumstances of the ancient Thai legal system before the legal system and judicial process reformation in Thailand, including the influences of major western legal systems on Thai laws.

#### **230407 Legal Philosophy**

**3(3-0-6)**

Biography and works of renowned legal philosophers in schools of thoughts; fundamental philosophy of legal theories, with emphasis on the meaning of law; concept of state, sovereignty, penalty, right, justice, social fairness, equality, and law enforcement; influence of legal philosophy on law making and applying.

#### **230408 Legal Research**

**4(2-4-6)**

This course will address the characteristics of legal research distinct from research in other fields. Topics will include access to primary and secondary sources and authorities, ranking and weighing thereof, types of legal research, writing a proposal, research methods, techniques, and process. Particular attention will be devoted to writing and editing a research paper, citation and presentation of a research paper developing between student and supervisor. Ethics for legal research will also be emphasized.

**230409 Alternative Dispute Resolution****2(1-2-3)**

Procedure of alternative dispute resolution both in and out of court; for example, arbitration, conciliation and compromise, and current problems caused by dispute resolution in court as well as court resolution guidelines using the basic ideas of the law of court procedure, practice in case study on alternative dispute resolution.

**230410 Intellectual Property Law****2(2-0-4)**

Principles, sources, and the importance of intellectual property, the classifications of intellectual property rights such as copyright, patent and trademark including legal protection and enforcement, right examination and protection eligibility.

**230413 Consumer Protection Law****2(2-0-4)**

Concepts relating to the protection of rights and benefits of consumers; consumer protection law and its enforcement.

**230415 Industrial Law****2(2-0-4)**

Laws involving establishment and control of factory operation; industrial estate law; machine registration law; hazardous substance law; including the law controlling pollution produced by industrial conduction.

**230420 International Trade Law****2(2-0-4)**

Evolution and sources of international trade law; international agreement and regulations concerning international trade contracts, such as CIF, C&F and FOB; international payment. The course including a study of international economic regulations affecting international trade; General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade and the Agreements under the WTO. Including dispute settlement of international trade.

**230422 International Organization Law****2(2-0-4)**

Evolution and establishment of international organizations, general legal theories relating to international organizations, universal and regional international organizations, and their relationships.

**230423 International Environmental Law****2(2-0-4)**

Evolution of international environmental law and its key concepts, international institutions and agreements concerning environment, relationship between international environmental law and trade, investment, society, and international politics, influence of international environmental law on states' policy and legislation.

**230425 International Law of the Sea****2(2-0-4)**

Nature and sources of the law of the sea, maritime delimitation, exclusive economic zone, high seas, state maritime jurisdiction, exploitation of living and non-living maritime resources.

**230427 International Economic Law****2(2-0-4)**

An introductory course exploring the evolution of international economic law subsequent to the end of World War II. The establishment of a world economic order under the Bretton Woods System composed of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD). A history and an overview of the World Trade Organization (WTO). A study of the evolution of international investment law and its continuously increasing importance as well as settlement of international investment disputes under the rules of the International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes (ICSID).

**230430 Administrative Court and Procedure****2(2-0-4)**

Development, system of administrative courts, judicial control over state power exercised by administrative organs; jurisdiction of administrative courts, administrative court's procedure, execution of administrative judgments.

**230432 Administrative Procedural Law****2(2-0-4)**

Substantive and procedural principles of administrative law relating to administrative acts, administrative procedure, discretionary power, internal control of administrative acts, revocation of administrative acts, request for retrial, administrative execution and commission on administrative procedure.

**230436 Legal methods on Public Law****21-2-3)**

Selected issues on public law topic, assign to research, discuss and analyze.

**230437 Special Topics on International Law 2(1-2-3)**

Selected issues on international law topic, assign to research, discuss and analyze.

**230438 Laws Related to Constitution 2(2-0-4)**

History, meaning and evolution of laws related to Constitution, substantial principles of laws related to Constitution as enshrined in some important laws related to Constitution, e.g., the laws on the election of members of the House of Representatives and senators, the Election Commission, and political parties.

**230440 Juvenile Justice Law 2(2-0-4)**

Legal principles and problematic social issues, psychology of juvenile delinquents, judicial process, juvenile court system, wrongdoer remedy, minor protection in civil suits according to the Juvenile Court Establishment Law and Juvenile Case Procedure Law.

**230443 Criminology and Penology 2(2-0-4)**

Crime causation and factors related to crime, the prevention of crime, including the handling and correction of offenders.

**230444 Economic Crimes 2(2-0-4)**

Meaning of economic crime, criminal offenses relating to business, state's preventive measures and mechanisms for economic crime. Including a study of laws related to economic crime, such as, money laundering law.

**230446 Special Topics on Criminal Law 2(1-2-3)**

Selected issue on Criminal Law topic, assign to research, discuss and analyze.

**230451 Human Rights Law 2(2-0-4)**

Meaning and philosophy of human rights, protection of human rights by the United Nations, protection of human rights at the international and regional levels, protection of human rights under Thai law.



**230452 Law on Conservation of Natural Resources, Environment, Art, and Culture 3(3-0-6)**

This course will examine concepts, state policy, and domestic law relating to the conservation and sustainable management of natural resources, promotion and protection of environmental quality, pollution control, conservation of art and cultural sites, and the international law on the conservation of natural resources, environment, art, and culture.

**230460 Telecommunication Law****2(2-0-4)**

Various types of telecommunication industries; public policies on telecommunication services; telecommunication services operated by private sectors; the regulatory bodies of telecommunication services; anti-monopoly and consumer protection; Attention will be paid to laws affecting the use of internet and new technology.

**230461 Information Technology Law****2(2-0-4)**

Ideas for legal enactment to solve problems caused by information technology development by learning from real problems, for example, laws related to electronic transactions, personal information protection, computer-related crimes, development of information infrastructures, and intellectual property laws related to information technology, such as, copyright and domain name.

**230470 Contractual Drafting and Negotiation****2(1-2-3)**

Juristic act, contractual drafting, types of contracts, including the use of legal terminologies, Including preparation and skills in negotiating.

**230471 Maritime Law****2(2-0-4)**

Legal principles relating to international carriage of goods by sea, various contracts on hire of ship. Maritime insurance, average of damages of goods in the ship. Right of practitioners in the sea; salvage and collision at sea.

**230475 Advocacy and Moot Court****2(1-2-3)**

Principles of establishment and management of law firms, legal counseling, principles of advocacy including the preparation of lawsuit such as drafting of complaints, pleading, motion and general principles regarding introduction of evidence. This course requires students to present a case in a moot courtroom.

**230476 English for Lawyers I****2(1-2-3)**

An introductory course covering the use of legal English necessary for lawyers, the use of legal terminology, the composition of basic legal sentences; and the elements of persuasive legal writing and speaking.

**230477 English for Lawyers II****2(1-2-3)**

Practice in legal argumentation and writing basic documents, such as, memoranda, notices, case briefs, opinion, journal articles, and contracts.

**230478 Introduction to law (non-law students)****3(3-0-6)**

A study of Meaning and general characteristics of law, sources of law; evolution, of law and legal system; types and hierarchy of law, concepts of law; principles of right and action, law making process; essential principles under constitutional and administrative law; principles under Civil and Commercial Code and civil procedure; principles under criminal law and criminal procedure, including laws related to daily life.

**230486 Special Topics on Civil and Business Law****2(1-2-3)**

Selected issues on civil and business law topics, assign to research, discuss and analyze.

**230487 Special Topics on Procedural Law****2(1-2-3)**

Selected issues on procedural law topics, assign to research, discuss and analyze.
